

## Holocaust Educator Professional Development Grant

Funded through the generosity of Dr. Julius Ciembroniewicz, the Holocaust Educator Professional Development Grant provides financial support to outstanding Maine teachers – at any grade level, public or private – committed to Holocaust and human rights education.

Awarded annually, the \$500 grant must be used to acquire knowledge or develop skills that enhance the recipient’s effectiveness as a teacher. Previous recipients not eligible for 5 years after receiving winning grant.

Application deadline: **April 15, 2019**. Grants winners will be notified in May.

Please attach a line-item budget to your proposal, not to exceed \$500. Grants will fund activities for the twelve-month period commencing on the date of the award. Recipients will be invited to present, in writing or in person, any significant outcomes of this grant, including student performance, breakthroughs in pedagogy, or newly developed lessons and materials.
